Değerli İlgili;

T.C. Ticaret Bakanlığı İthalat Genel Müdürlüğünden alınan bir yazıda, bilindiği üzere, Endonezya tarafından "Sigara Kağıdı" (Endonezya gümrük tarife cetveline göre 813.20.21, 4813.20.23, 4813.20.31, ex4813.20.32, 4813.90.11, ex4813.90.19, 4813.90.91 ve ex4813.90.99 gümrük tarife pozisyonunda sınıflandırılan) ithalatına karşı 30 Kasım 2021 tarihinden bu yana yürürlükte olan ve ülkemizin Dünya Ticaret Örgütü Korunma Önlemleri Anlaşması'nın (Anlaşma) 9.1 maddesi kapsamında muaf bulunduğu korunma önleminin uzatılmasına ilişkin yürütülen gözden geçirme soruşturması neticesinde, ciddi zararı önlemek veya gidermek için önlemin uzatılmasının gerekli olduğu bulgusuna istinaden mezkur önlemin uzatılmasının öngörüldüğü, 11 Eylül 2023 tarihli DTÖ Bildirimi ile iletildiği belirtilmekte olup bu defa, 19 Ocak 2024 tarihinde yayımlanan ve Ek'te yer verilmiş olan bildirime göre, anılan ülke tarafından korunma önleminin, 3 Ocak 2024 – 2 Ocak 2025 tarihleri arasında 3.923.900 IDR/ton, 3 Ocak 2025 – 2 Ocak 2026 tarihleri arasında 3.885.850 IDR/ton ve 3 Ocak 2026 – 2 Ocak 2027 tarihleri arasında 3.847.800 IDR/ton şeklinde uygulanmak üzere uzatılmasına hükmedilmiş olduğu ifade edilmektedir.

Yazıda devamla, mezkûr bildirimin incelenmesinden de görülebileceği üzere ülkemizin, Endonezya tarafından aynı kapsamda önlemden muaf tutulmuş olduğu bildirilmektedir. Bu konusu gelişmenin, Endonezya'ya ilgili ürünlerin ihracatını gerçekleştiren/gerçekleştirmeyi öngören firmalarımız açısından bir rekabet avantajı sağlayabileceğinin değerlendirilmekte olduğu belirtilmektedir. Bununla birlikte, Anlaşma'nın 9.1 maddesi hükümleri dikkate alındığında, Endonezya'nın ilgili ürünler ithalatındaki payımızın önümüzdeki dönemde % 3'ün üzerine çıkması halinde bahsedilen önleme dâhil edilme ihtimalimizin de göz önünde bulundurulmasının faydalı olacağı mütalaa edilmektedir.

The following communication, dated and received on 19 January 2024, is being circulated at the request of the delegation of Indonesia.

Pursuant to Article 7.2 and Article 12.1(c) of the WTO Agreement on Safeguards, the Republic of Indonesia hereby notifies to extend the imposition of a safeguard measures in the form of specific safeguard duty on the importation of Subject Good, for a period of 3 (three) years by the issuance of Minister of Finance's Decree Number 151 Year 2023 dated 27 December 2023, promulgated in the Official Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia Year 2023 Number 1056 on 28 December 2023.

GENERAL BACKGROUND

On 11 September 2023 the Republic of Indonesia notified the findings of investigation in which it was concluded that the relevant safeguard measure needs to be extended, in particular, to prevent or remedy serious injury suffered by the Applicant. The extension of such safeguard measures will also give the Applicant the opportunity to continue their adjustment program in order to improve the competitiveness of domestic industry (G/SG/N/8/IDN/29/Suppl.2 - G/SG/N/10/IDN/29/Suppl.2 - G/SG/N/11/IDN/27)

It was also indicated in the notification that the Investigating Authority was proposing to the Government of the Republic of Indonesia, to extend the imposition of a safeguard measures duty on the importation of the Subject Goods in the form of specific safeguard duty.

SUBJECT GOOD

"Cigarette Paper and Plug Wrap Paper Non-Porous", under the Indonesia Harmonized System (HS.) Code: 4813.20.21, 4813.20.23, 4813.20.31, ex4813.20.32, 4813.90.11, ex4813.90.19, 4813.90.91 and ex4813.90.99" in accordance with Indonesian Tariff Book (BTKI) 2022.

DESCRIPTION OF THE SAFEGUARD MEASURE

1. With reference to the proposal from the Investigating Authority, and taking into account the need to effectuate the safeguard measure as proposed and the relevant requirement stipulated in the WTO Agreement on Safeguards, the Government of the Republic of Indonesia has decided to impose the following safeguard duty:
